LAND Trust Funds

Each year the School Community Council, comprised of faculty and parents of students who attend Willowcreek, are tasked with creating an improvement plan using LAND Trust funds. This plan focusing on the greatest academic needs for students. Willowcreek was allocated a total of \$243,022 in LAND Trust monies for the 2020-21 school year.

These funds were used for three academic coaches, one math aide, summer collaboration grants for all content area teams, late bus Tuesday, and online teaching staff.


The students love making new friends in Social Dance Class. This class provides each student the opportunity to collaborate with their ever changing partnerships.
