

PTSA PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Good attendance is the “real” ticket to school success. Unexcused and even excused absences challenge any student’s success. Students who are frequently absent miss out on important lessons and hands-on practice that isn’t easy or practical to recreate. What’s more, junior high school is simply more challenging — and essential — than ever before.



The National Science Foundation estimates that in 2010, as many as one-fourth of all jobs will be based on math, science and technology. Additionally, the number of new U.S. jobs requiring math and science — from retail sales to high-tech computer software design and programming — continues to grow. Without adequate skills and early training in these subjects, some fear that American students will be less qualified than their peers overseas for desirable jobs. Consider, too, foreign language studies, another junior high school staple. Not only do they teach cultural awareness (life enriching and increasingly important in our global economy), but they also provide students with the ability to communicate well and work together with their peers worldwide.

School needs to be Job One. On average, junior high school students have one to two hours of homework each night. Even one missed day can mean having to tackle three or more hours of homework the following night — practically a guarantee that kids won’t be doing their best work in the rush to just get through it all. Regular school attendance also teaches children the ethics of responsibility and dedication. These character traits, along with strong academic and technical knowledge, are what today’s employers say they value most in those they hire.



Kids need to know that, unless they are truly unwell, you expect them to go to school every day and do their best while there. Here are some suggestions:

- Make attendance and academics a priority. Show them that going off to work and meeting your commitments — even when it might seem tempting to call in “sick” — is something you do, too. Let them know that school attendance and homework come before time with friends, extracurricular activities or the computer. Also, help them understand the consequences of missing school in terms that will hit home for them (e.g., having to stay after school to make up missed work, missing out on after-school sports and clubs or time with friends).
- Help them get organized. Create a space in your home for kids to store backpacks, coats, sneakers and other supplies. Develop a routine where children help pack their own lunches and backpacks and do necessary laundry the night before. This will make mornings less hectic and help kids arrive at school on time each day.
- Set reasonable bedtimes. On average, junior high kids need about nine hours of sleep to be healthy and alert. As they move into the teen years, kids’ brains begin to signal them to stay up later — and to sleep in later the next day. Despite what nature is telling them, reinforce reasonable bedtimes for your children and encourage them to get up and get ready on their own.

Make medical and other appointments during non-school hours whenever possible. Schedule family vacations during school holidays or the summer break so students aren’t missing important lessons and struggling to make up for lost time. Making school attendance a priority helps children learn the good work and study habits that will serve them well now and throughout their lives.

MENSAJE DE LA PRESIDENTA DE PTSA

Buena asistencia es el boleto “real” para el éxito en la escuela. Ausencias no excusadas o aun excusadas ponen en riesgo el éxito del estudiante. Los estudiantes que frecuentemente tienen ausencias pierden lecciones importantes y el no participar en la práctica la cual no es fácil de volver a crear. Que más, la secundaria es simplemente más desafiante—y esencial—como nunca antes.

La Fundación Nacional de Ciencias calcula que en 2010, un cuarto de todos los trabajos serán basados en las matemáticas, ciencias y la tecnología. Adicionalmente, el número de nuevos trabajos en Estados Unidos siguen creciendo, los cuales requieren matemáticas y ciencias—desde ventas hasta diseñadores de computación de alta tecnología y programación. Sin tener habilidades adecuadas y entrenamiento temprano en estas materias, algunos temen que los estudiantes americanos serán poco calificados en comparación con otros estudiantes de otros países para trabajos deseados. Considero, también, el estudio de otros idiomas es otra base de la escuela secundaria. No solamente enseña conocimiento cultural (enriquecimiento de la vida, algo importante en nuestra economía global), también provee a los estudiantes con la habilidad de comunicarse de una manera adecuada en el trabajo y con sus compañeros a nivel mundial.

La escuela necesita ser el Trabajo Número Uno. En promedio, los estudiantes de secundaria tienen de una a dos horas de tareas cada noche. Aun si pierden un día de escuela significa tener que acumular tres o más horas de tarea la siguiente noche.—prácticamente, es una garantía, que los estudiantes no harán el mejor trabajo al tardar de hacer toda la tarea en carrera. Al asistir regularmente también les enseña a los estudiantes la ética de la responsabilidad y la dedicación. Estas características junto con el conocimiento académico y técnico, es lo que los empleadores dicen que es de gran valor en aquellos que contratan.

Los niños necesitan saber esto, al menos que estén realmente enfermos, usted espera que ellos asistan a la escuela cada día y que hagan lo mejor que puedan al estar allí. A continuación hay algunas sugerencias que pueden ayudar:

- Haga una prioridad la asistencia a la escuela y lo académico. Demuestreles que al ir al trabajo y al cumplir con sus responsabilidades—aun que sea tentador llamar que está “enfermo”—es algo que usted hace, también. Hágales saber que la asistencia a la escuela y hacer tareas viene antes que pasar tiempo con amigos, actividades extra-aula o la computadora. También, ayudeles a entender las consecuencias de faltar a la escuela, (por ejemplo: que deben quedarse después de la escuela para hacer el trabajo que no hicieron, no permitirles ir a actividades como deportes, clubs o pasar tiempo con amigos.)
- Ayúdenles a ser organizados. Cree espacio para las mochilas, los sueteres, zapatos y otros artículos de los niños. Desarrolle una rutina en donde los niños preparen sus propios almuerzos y sus mochilas y que laven la ropa que necesiten la noche anterior. Esto ayudará a que las mañanas sean menos agitadas y que los niños puedan llegar a la escuela a tiempo cada día.
- Póngales horarios razonables para irse a dormir. En promedio, estudiantes de secundaria deben de tener 9 horas para dormir para que estén saludables y alerta. Cuando se convierten en adolescentes, los cerebros de ellos envían señales de que deben permanecer despiertos tarde—y que duerman extra en la mañana. A pesar de lo que la naturaleza les este indicando, refuerce los horarios que ha puesto para irse a la cama y desafíelos a que se levanten y que se alisten ellos solos para ir a la escuela.

Haga las citas médicas y otras durante horas después de la escuela, cuando sea posible. Planee vacaciones familiares durante feriados o en el verano para que los estudiantes no pierdan lecciones importantes y que luego tengan problema en la escuela por el tiempo perdido. Hacer que la asistencia a la escuela sea una prioridad ayuda a los niños a aprender el buen trabajo y hábitos de estudio que les ayudarán en gran medida ahora y durante el resto de sus vidas.


