# WAYS TO GET COLLEGE CREDITS WHILE STILL IN HIGH SCHOOL

Who would want to get college credits while still in high school?

Students who want to save time and money getting a college degree.

Students who are working towards the New Century Scholarship.

Students who are seeking an advanced degree and want a head start.

#### CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT

Concurrent Enrollment is a program where students enrolled in certain high school courses may be concurrently enrolled in a "companion" course at a local college or university. This means that students may receive college credits for taking high school classes. Cost is minimal.

## ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP)

Advanced Placement classes are college level classes taught in the high school. Students receive regular high school credit for taking the class and can opt to pay a fee (around \$75) to take a test in the spring. If passed, the student receives about 8 college semester credits.

#### MATC

(Mountainland Applied Technology College)

In partnership with Utah County school districts, the Mountainland Applied Technology College at UVSC provides high school students with state-of-the-art advanced training programs during school hours for high school and college credits. Cost is minimal.

## DISTANCE LEARNING & EDNET

Distance Learning is where UVSC offers interactive television classes at AF High. College credit is available for over 20 classes.

EdNet is Utah Education Network's interactive system that electronically brings college classes into other sites.

### ON CAMPUS CLASSES

Students can sign up for general education classes at UVSC or other college campuses. Students can attend part or full time. 3 college credits are equivalent to 1 high school credit. In addition, there are 45 different Applied Technology programs at UVSC students can take during their senior year.

#### **ELECTRONIC COMMUNITY COLLEGE**

The UECC has been created to help students enroll in college classes to further their education or obtain an associate degree electronically. There is a cost for college credit.
